BSU Partners with DSWD for the Cash for Work Program

Benguet State University (BSU) and the Department of Social Welfare and Development - Cordillera (DSWD-CAR) collaborates for the Cash for Work (C4W) Program.

The KALAHI Cash for Work (C4W) Program aims to provide fresh college graduates with an opportunity to gain hands-on experience while earning. Through this program, 500 BSU graduates have been employed and are currently undergoing work-internship in various government offices across the region.

The program directly contributes to the goal of eradicating poverty by offering economic support to fresh graduates who are entering the job market with limited work experience. By providing these graduates with the opportunity to work, the program empowers them to support themselves and their families, alleviating financial stress and creating pathways out of poverty. This initiative also enables graduates to acquire valuable skills that increase their future employability.

BSU Offers Masters Degree in AgroEcology

Benguet State University (BSU) has taken a significant step forward in its academic offerings with the introduction of the Master of Science in AgroEcology, made possible through the Erasmus Project, Curriculum Development in AgroEcology (CDAE). This innovative program is designed to address the multifaceted challenges of agriculturally utilized landscapes, emphasizing sustainable development principles.

The Master's program received official approval from the Board of Regents on July 27, 2023, under BOR Resolution No. 43 s. 2023. Subsequently, in August 2023, the program welcomed its first cohort of seven students, making BSU the first university among the consortium to offer this Master's degree. Instruction is provided by the esteemed faculty members from the College of Agriculture (CA), College of Forestry (CF), and College of Natural Sciences (CNS).

BSU celebrates class of 2023, Sets New Record in Number and Latin Honors

A total of 1,502 graduates were conferred their diplomas at Benguet State University Gymnasium during the university's 98th Commencement Exercises on July 20-21, 2023. Apart from exceeding the previous year's total number of graduates, the '23 Class also surpassed the previous year's tally of 318 Latin honor recipients.

Since its founding, the university awarded this year 371 cum laude, 51 Magna cum laude, and the lone Summa cum laude of BSU in the person of Ms. Vjnhyl Zam A. Pondivida from the College of Information Sciences – Department of Development Communication, resulting in a total of 423 Latin honor graduates.



BSU-on-Air: 22 years of empowering life-long learners

Creating communities of learners from a distance is realized at its best through a radio program of Benguet State University. Dubbed as BSU School-on-Air, the program has been providing educational empowerment to various stakeholders.

BSU's School-on-the-Air segment has proven to be an effective broadcast-based distance learning system, as evidenced by several surveys from 2017 to 2022. To date, a total of 13 SoA programs have been conducted, with eight of them initiated by the OES in collaboration with various partners, resulting in over 2,500 farmer graduates.

BSU-College of Engineering Offers Technical Assistance to Cherway Farms for Biogas Digester Project

Benguet State University's College of Engineering (BSU-CE) extended its expertise to Cherway Farm, a piggery farm located in Bontoc, Mountain Province, by providing technical assistance to support a sustainable energy solution through the construction of a biogas digester. This initiative aligns with BSU's commitment to promoting environmentally friendly technologies within local communities, highlighting their continued involvement in sustainable development projects.

The project officially commenced with a site visit by a team of BSU-CE faculty members on May 18, 2023. Professors and engineers from the college, including Prof. John James F. Malamug, Engr. Erickson N. Dominguez, Engr. Kevin P. Titiwa, and Engr. Alvin C. Dulay, met with Cherway Farm's owner to assess the farm's layout and discuss the potential integration of a biogas digester system. During the visit, the team evaluated the site's readiness for biogas technology, which would harness waste from the piggery to produce renewable energy while reducing waste accumulation.

Following the site assessment, the BSU-CE team collaborated to create a tailored blueprint and detailed construction plan, which was later presented to Cherway Farm's management. In their follow-up visit on October 13, 2023, the team provided the farm with the finalized design, complete with construction estimates and technical specifications, bringing the project a step closer to implementation.

This biogas digester project is poised to transform waste management practices at Cherway Farm, generating biogas that can be used as a renewable source of energy and reducing the farm's environmental footprint.

BSU Launches Project TuTuKK Dangayan



This project aims to address some of the pressing issues besetting the region given this time of pandemic where there is a rising number of out-of-youth, learners who did not continue their studies due to troubling experiences and graduates who are unemployed. Furthermore, this project aims to uplift the motivation of the learners and participants to pursue and succeed in life.

Twelve individuals completed the ATBI farming and food processing incubation program on September 2, 2023. During the ceremony, the 12 completers were also sworn as members of the BSU ATBI Alumni Agriculture Cooperative which was established by the BSU ATBI/IC together with the first completers of the ATBI program in 2020. At present, the Cooperative has 49 members who maintain a training market pavilion at the strawberry farm BSU parking area where they sell their different farm produce.

Best of all, the museum is open to all visitors and has no entrance fee, making it accessible to everyone.

BSU Conducts Program on Decelerating Postharvest Losses



Benguet State University (BSU) joined the DOST-PCAARD, the University of the Philippines, and 4 other Philippine SUCs in conducting the SPRINT-Hort Program Postharvest System Improvement of Selected Horticultural Value Chains Project.

The SPRINT-Hort Program aims to address and reduce postharvest losses in horticultural crops by focusing on improving the postharvest systems of selected value chains across nine provinces in the Philippines. In December 2023, the program made significant strides through its field activities, particularly the Face-to-Face (F2F) survey. This survey was carried out with local carrot farmers in Buguias, Benguet, to gather essential data regarding the carrot value chain at the farm gate level. As the program moves forward, it continues to gather valuable insights and refining its approach to postharvest system improvements contributing to the overall sustainable production patterns.

New FSRIC Innovation Combines Tomato and Lemon for Flavorful Fusion, Tackles Food Waste Reduction

Taking advantage of the abundance of tomatoes and lemons, innovators from Benguet State University Food Science Research and Innovation Center (FSRIC) developed a technology in the form of reduced sugar tomato-lemon marmalade.

With tomatoes' low shelf life or fast rate of spoilage, vast supplies are becoming waste. The mixture aimed to utilize the abundance of tomatoes. The initiative addresses food waste through the preservation of oversupplied produce. The reduced sugar tomato-lemon marmalade not only helps reduce food waste but also provides consumers with a healthier option compared to other similar products on the market.

The marmalade not only proves a promising solution for oversupply but also offers potential incomes for tomato producers or anyone else. FSRIC developed a technology guide to ensure the transfer of this technology to the community. The guide includes step-by-step instructions on how to produce marmalade, as well as tips on marketing and selling the product. By sharing their knowledge and expertise, FSRIC is empowering communities to create sustainable solutions for food waste and economic growth.

BSU Supports BFAR-CAR in Advancing Aquaculture in the Cordilleras



Benguet State University (BSU) has significantly contributed to aquaculture development in the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR) through its La Trinidad Fish Farm (LTFF). Established in 1971 and located within the BSU compound, the LTFF spans approximately 3 hectares, with 1.75 hectares dedicated to fish cultivation and productive activities and the remainder used for infrastructure on a mountain slope. This long-standing facility remains a vital source of sustainable fish production for the region, illustrating BSU's dedication to responsible resource management.

As a regional supplier of tilapia and common carp, the La Trinidad Fish Farm plays a significant role in promoting sustainable aquaculture practices. By fostering the availability of these species, BSU aids local farmers, reduces the need for imported fish seed, and contributes to the long-term conservation of aquatic ecosystems.

BSU Students Champion Aquatic Ecosystem Preservation through the Adopt-a-River Program

Benguet State University (BSU) fosters a commitment to aquatic ecosystem preservation through its student-led "Adopt-a-River" program, focused on revitalizing the Balili River near the campus. Students regularly organize clean-up drives, removing waste and pollutants that endanger river health and aquatic life. These efforts directly support life in local waters, as a cleaner river sustains biodiversity, provides a healthier habitat for fish and plant species, and prevents downstream pollution from impacting larger water bodies.

In addition, BSU's awareness campaigns during World Water Day and International Coastal and Inland Water Cleanup Day emphasize the vital role of inland waters in supporting life below water, as outlined in Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 14. These campaigns educate the community about how pollution affects aquatic ecosystems and the importance of safeguarding water quality for all species. an appreciation for the complex ecosystems within rivers and streams, inspiring students and the community to take action for a sustainable, thriving environment.

BSU Joins Project SAGIP; Student Scholars to Lead Greening Movement

In an inspiring move towards environmental sustainability, Benguet State University (BSU) has signed on to support Project SAGIP, a climate action initiative by the Commission on Higher Education-CAR (CHED-CAR) in collaboration with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources-CAR (DENR-CAR) and 34 other higher education institutions. Project SAGIP engages student scholars in a collective greening effort, requiring them to plant and care for trees as part of their scholarship commitments.

Under Project SAGIP, student beneficiaries of various CHED financial assistance programs will plant at least one fruit-bearing or indigenous tree in their local communities annually. Beyond planting, students will be responsible for the ongoing maintenance and monitoring of their trees to ensure successful growth, with technical guidance and seedlings supplied by DENR-CAR's local offices. DENR-CAR will also provide experts to conduct learning sessions on forestry, climate change, and environmental stewardship, further deepening students' understanding of their role in sustainability.

Flight for Conservation: Uncovering the Birdlife of BSU's Land Reservation



making BSU a valuable spot for birdwatching and ecotourism.



The natural landscapes of Benguet State University (BSU)-La Trinidad Campus and its surrounding land reservations are more than just green expanses – they are sanctuaries for diverse bird species that play a critical role in the local ecosystem. Recognizing the importance of these bird populations, a recent study titled "Flight for Conservation: The Birds of Benguet State University Land Reservation" by Forester Gerry M. Alfonso explored and documented the bird species within these areas. Forty-six bird species from 27 families were cataloged. Forty-four of the identified species are indigenous to the Philippines, and among these, 15 are endemic to the country. The presence of these endemic species, including the Scale-Feathered Malkoha and Spotted Wood Kingfisher, emphasizes the importance of preserving the BSU land reservations as key habitats. These two species are also among the top ten "must-see birds" in the Philippines,
